Guide me to give comfort and calm to those I encounter. Amen.





NOTES ON THE MUSIC

Kola Owolabi is a noted and award-winning organist and composer, currently serving as Professor of Organ at Notre Dame University, with previous appointments at the University of Michigan and Syracuse University.

In keeping with our "reclaim and reframe" theme for the year, I'm playing another passacaglia. A passacaglia is, basically, a set of variations over a repeating bass line (which I think is a musical version of "reclaim and reframe"--a constant foundation with ever developing ideas superimposed above). West was a late 19th/early 20th century British composer, one clearly influenced by developments in German organ music of the time since the piece carries a dedication to Rheinberger, a noted contemporaneous German organ composer.
